




Bathe me in my true essence, 2020 Digital Collage


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Star Boy, 2020 Digital collage

I wanted to use photographs of men in seemingly vulnerable states. In my culture, young boys and men are discouraged from showing vulnerability, but I believe that that vulnerability is what makes them beautiful. I wanted to show the beauty and growth of vulnerability in men.





The aim of the 'Healing' project is to discuss how colonization influenced family structure in Cabo Verde and open a dialogue around it. In this first part, the installation aimed to create a feeling of comfort and home. The participants were invited to 'talk' to their family using the phone and answer the question 'What is something that happened in your family that you will take with you forever?', they were also invited to resume in a word what they felt during the experiment, to write in a piece of paper and place it on the safe can.

The inspiration for this piece came from the things we whisper in the family instead of talking about them out loud.
